VINTAGE WOODS

Appearance, log source, sourcing, and relative pricing.

CVG = Clear Vertical Grain | SYP = Southern Yellow Pine



APPEARANCE SELECTION
Rustic Mix

Mixed grain, color variation, knots, mineral streaking, and other natural character. Creates a warm, varied exterior appearance.

Broader recovery across the log, including mixed grain and boards with more visible character.

MOST ACCESSIBLE

The broadest usable recovery generally supports the most accessible relative price.



APPEARANCE SELECTION
Clear Mix

A clearer face with limited visible defects. Mixed grain is allowed, creating a refined appearance without requiring all vertical grain.

Selected from clearer portions of the log, without limiting recovery to vertical-grain cuts.

SELECTIVE

An accumulated selection requiring additional sorting and time to build inventory. Priced above Rustic Mix.



APPEARANCE SELECTION
CVG

A clear face with tight, straight, consistent vertical grain. The most refined and uniform appearance.

Recovered from the limited portions of the log where growth rings can be oriented vertically to the board face.

PREMIUM

The lowest recovery and slowest accumulation create the highest relative price.



SPECIES GROUP
SYP

A strong, resinous softwood with bold grain, warm color, and pronounced growth rings. Appearance varies by grade and cut.

A botanical species group rather than an appearance selection. Grain orientation depends on the specified grade and cut.

MARKET-DEPENDENT

Relative pricing is based on dimensions and current availability.

Why “Accumulated” Matters

Clear Mix and CVG are accumulated selections. Qualifying boards are collected over time rather than recovered in predictable quantities from every log. Lower yield and slower inventory build can contribute to longer lead times and higher relative pricing.
